Dear Parents/Carers,

This summer term, there are plenty of opportunities for your child to develop their leadership skills at Knightswood Secondary School. Our wide range of extracurricular clubs give them the chance to develop their collaboration and social skills through participation and volunteering. There are a number of new clubs this term, details of which are listed below. Pupils are encouraged to keep a record of their volunteer work to gain accreditation. Students from all year groups can work towards getting the Saltire Award and pupils from S3 to S6 can work towards acquiring the SQA Volunteering Skills Award. Currently, we have 19 young people enrolled in the Volunteering Skills Award course and over 100 young people who are working towards getting the Saltire Award. We are in the process of establishing a Mini Leadership Academy for our young people. The aim of the Mini Leadership Academy is to help our students develop resilience, leadership, communication and problem solving skills through mentoring and workshops.

Get a Saltire certificate at the end of the academic year if they have completed the required number of hours for a certain level.
