	<div><div></div><h3>Anti-Bullying Charter</h3><div><ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. All children and young people have human rights. Bullying is a breach of Children's Rights and children need to be protected from bullying behaviour.</li><li>2. Bullying behaviour is never acceptable.</li><li>3. Bullying behaviour needs to be challenged and effectively addressed.</li><li>4. Adults have an important role to play.</li><li>5. Bullying behaviour will not be tolerated; this helps to create an environment where bullying behaviour is less likely to thrive.</li><li>6. Children have the right to protection from all forms of physical or mental violence, injury or abuse.</li></ol></div><div><p><b>We will:</b></p><ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Listen</li><li>• Acknowledge and address bullying behaviour</li><li>• Respect and support everyone involved</li><li>• Record, monitor and review bullying behaviour</li></ul></div></div>

It is against the law for young people under the age of 18 to purchase or possess fireworks.</p> <p>Young people should not be on the railway lines at any time.</p>	<p>Social Media top tips for parent/carers:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Speak to your young person about using social media appropriately</li><li>2. Do not share passwords with friends or peers</li><li>3.
