



• Rights Respecting Schools The term 'Rights Respecting School' is given to schools that put the work of UNICEF at the heart of their educational policies and practices.


• All children have rights, and along with those rights come responsibilities.

• • Right of the Week



To help further our rights within the school, we will focus on a certain right every week.

The next right you have chosen to focus on is Article 2- The Right to be free from discrimination.

Everyone in our school has the right to be free from discrimination. This means that it's your right not to be treated worse than others for any reason such as age, race, gender, disability, or hair colour, or for combined reasons, such as being a young, black, disabled person.
